TV's Dr. Lori brings appraisal expertise to Novi show

Lori Verderame fell in love with antiques at a young age. As a child, she would spend weekends visiting yard sales, antique shops and flea markets with her father, who encouraged her to understand the art of antique appraisals.

She took that love all the way to a doctorate in art history, museum studies, antiques and appraisals, which she earned at Penn State University. Now she appears on TV as Dr. Lori, an expert for Fox Business Network and Discovery Channel's "Auction Kings.

The famed antique appraiser brings her skills to the Novi Home Improvement Show this weekend at the Suburban Collection Showplace.

The author of "An Amer-

ican Sculptor" and the upcoming title "Don't Host a Yard Sale" has been appraising items for decades, and appraises 20,000 objects a year at 150 events worldwide annually. What she loves most is the stories she hears and learning about the items with her audience, she said in an email interview last week.

Ever the show-woman, she will host "Dr. Lori's Antiques Appraisal Comedy Show" on the Inspiration stage in Novi, and says is excited to return to this year's show. For guests, she will appraise one item for free, with additional appraisals at \$25 per item. She recommends bringing pictures if an item cannot be physically brought to the show.

Dr. Lori uses many factors to determine an item's

She can authenticate objects dating back to ancient many tricks of the trade at times. She helps collectors learn more about the history of rare things and their values.

Determining value can be tricky if the item is one of a kind. For example, the most unusual item Dr. Lori ever had to authentic was President George Washington's wallet. She appraised the wallet's value at \$100,000. The highest value appraisal Dr. Lori has ever given was \$2 million for Napoleon Bonaparte's gem-encrusted good luck charm from the Battle of Waterloo. appraisals, I will teach you my appraisal event," she said. "I will teach you how to sell for top dollar, how to avoid antique scams, how to identify valuable antiques, art, collectibles from all places and all time periods, show you how to preserve all types of items, etc."

The Meadow Brook Music Festival in Rochester Hills has been renamed Meadow Brook Amphitheatre in keeping with its nature.

"The venue has great history and has played host to some of the best emerging superstar talent," Dennis Mannion, president and CEO of Palace Sports & Entertainment, said in a media release. "This rebrand further defines its true identity as one of the premier, intimate venues in the region."

On the campus of Oakland University, the amphitheater's small size and bucolic setting make it a favorite spot to see an outdoor concert, hosting such diverse fare as the Detroit Symphony Orchestra, folk
