

Contemporary Art Gallery in Ferndale is another piece of the puzzle helping to grow and expand the Detroit art community.

Owner **Melannie Chard** opened the gallery after years of working in the art industry. Chard started her art career in New York City, where she worked at **Sotheby's Auction House** for ten years. She was running the valuations department when she decided to move back to Michigan to be closer to family. Once settled, Chard began working as an independent consultant. "Kind of like helping people put paintings in their house." Chard explained. She met lots of artists while consulting and visiting numerous studios to learn the vernacular of the Detroit art community.

After a while, Chard ended up running an art gallery in Detroit. In 2018 she decided to take a leap and open **M Contemporary Art Gallery.** "I decided to start a gallery because I thought that my experience in the art world, in New York, could translate here and I thought I could help artists." Chard said. Her best friend told her about an available building in Ferndale that would be the perfect location for the gallery. Chard visited the building, but was a little hesitant at first because it wasn't in Detroit; and she worried about it being far from her artists and customers.

However, Chard quickly learned that many of her cli-

ents live in and around Ferndale. The location is a very accessible community for artists, collectors, visitors, etc. "People would come see me on a Saturday afternoon. When I was in Detroit, people didn't really do that. I get

lots of foot traffic," Chard said. **Joe Reilley** is the manager and helps Chard run M Contemporary Art Gallery.

CHARD WORKS PRIMARILY WITH DETROIT-BASED ARTISTS. She's helped artists grow through the years; watching their work sell from then hundreds to now thousands of dollars. "One of the things I really like to focus on is the emerging market; as well as helping artists that are just graduating, coming out of school, that kind of thing. There's so much talent here!"

Chard works with dozens of local artists, including: Scott Vincent Campbell, Alicia Brown, Kaleigh Belvins, Roy Feldman, Richard Lewis, Matthew Eaton, Ashley Marie, Rashaun Rucker, Rick Vian, Ivan Montoya, Cailyn Dawson, Robert Mirek, John McLaughlin and many, many others.

"When I find an artist that I'm going to work with or exhibit in the gallery it's because they have a visual style; or whatever they're doing is something I haven't seen or I don't have anything like that in the program. I have a really diverse program in terms of photography, painting, and all different types of people. I'm



always looking for the perspective that I haven't shown. That's something that's important to me." Chard said.


Once artists give their work to Chard for a gallery show or to sell, that's when her job really begins. "For them it's like okay now it's out in the world and now you have to trust me to do what I do and hopefully present it in the best way possible. That's really what I try to do." Chard said. After an exhibition at M Contemporary, Chard will sell the remaining work; either online, directly to collectors, etc. "I curate different collections to put online only." Chard said.

Art shows are rotated every month at the gallery. Chard hosts both group and singular exhibitions. So far in 2024 the gallery has showcased individual shows for **Ashley Marie, Ivan Montoya**, and **Bowen Kline**. In addition to hosting exhibitions, Chard works with interior designers, advises art collectors, puts together art proposals, and in general shares her broad depth of art knowledge with interested parties.


HARD BELIEVES IT'S IMPORTANT TO PROVIDE A PLACE for young, emerging artists to exhibit so they can learn the industry do's and don'ts. For example, bringing tools for art installations, having a

bio, listing artwork price, etc. "The more that these artists are around it, the more they're influenced by some of the older artists too. You can just see them grow. They grow really fast. It's really exciting."
