lemon, capers and artichokes served in a white wine-butter sauce; grilled center-cut pork chop stuffed with Boursin cheese, caramelized onions, apples and cherries in a port wine demiglace; blackened tilapia set in a pool of sweet and spicy tomato sauce and topped

with pineapple salsa, fresh cilantro and lime; grilled late-summer vegetables and oven-roasted redskin potatoes with rosemary. The dessert menu includes miniature root better floats and plum and blueberry upsidedown cake.

Laura Bayoff-Elkins, director of marketing at Palladium 12, says the theater is unique with having an in-house chef. "He uses his own creativity with the menu. His flair for food is exquisite," she said.
